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ANIMAL HERDSMANSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. The purpose and guiding principles of Herdsmanship are for exhibitors in the 4-H program to care for their animals, pens, and equipment properly, insure safety and keep stalls, pens, cages, surrounding areas and animals clean and attractive at all times. Educational displays and public relations are an important component of Herdsmanship.
2. It is the primary responsibility of 4-H exhibitor to do Herdsmanship. Non 4-H exhibitors or adults are to assist only prior to 10 a.m. if necessary. Failure of 4-H exhibitor to do Herdsmanship can result in forfeit of all awards and premiums, and removal from further participation in the respective 4-H Animal Division for the duration of the Fair and/ or 4-H State Fair Competition.
3. Herdsmanship must be performed each day of the Fair. An adult must be available in each area during the hours Fair is open to the public. (See respective animal divisions for additional details about Herdsmanship times, feeding times, etc.)
4. 4-H herdsman and supervising adults on duty must be identified in an obvious fashion. Exhibitors should be dressed in clean, neat attire and represent 4-H in a positive way. They must also wear appropriate footwear to the animal division. Be friendly and show courtesy to the public.
5. All animal superintendents should notify their respective 4-H exhibitors of specific barn rules and schedules.
6. While on duty, exhibitors will keep floors and aisle ways neat and clean, tack and feed areas neat and clean, and all animals and bedding clean and neat.
7. Wheelbarrows should be emptied regularly and kept out of aisle ways, tack and storage areas where applicable. Fair management provides manure dumpsters. 4-H members are expected to dump manure IN dumpsters not outside of dumpsters.
8. Exhibitors using the wash areas need to keep them clean and orderly, clear of manure and other debris. The wash racks are for livestock exhibitors. They are not for use by horse exhibitors. Fair management will determine wash area use.
9. Herdsmanship judges will examine the displays at least once a day, and will judge anytime during the times outlined in the respective animal divisions.
10. Herdsmanship is judged by clubs for horse, dairy, beef, sheep, swine, and goats.
11. 4-H members will receive one ribbon and respective premium points for the duration of the fair (i.e. they will not receive premiums or ribbons for each day of fair). They **will not** get premium points for each animal.
12. 4-H stall cards or 4-H cage cards will be furnished for each animal and **must** be displayed.
13. Each club must have its 4-H club name clearly displayed in such a manner that the public knows it is a 4-H club exhibit.
14. Greens, flowers, or crepe paper may be used, however, they must be fireproof.
15. Tack areas should be in good condition, clean and neat.

16. Ribbons earned during the current fair only may be displayed and no ribbons from other fairs, shows, or events may be displayed.

17. Awards are made to clubs based upon the following scorecard. Refer to specific animal divisions for additional information if applicable. If specific animal divisions have additional expectations or requirements, it will supersede Herdsmanship outlined in this section of the Premium Book, as long as 4-H exhibitors are aware of these additional requirements.

- Animals – 25%

Cleaned, groomed, water, feed and bedding appropriate to animal.

- Stalls, Pens, Cages and Grooming Areas – 20%

Clean and orderly; aisles, barn area and tack area clean and organized.

- Educational and Display Effects – 15%

Animal and exhibitor identified, stall cards and club name displayed. Display has educational value that provides information to the public.

- Exhibitors – 25%

Appearance, positive attitude, courtesy and skill. Herdsman identified as a 4-H'er and available to meet the public and oversee the animals. Proper attire including boots or sturdy shoes when on Herdsmanship duty. Herdsman to keep aisle way, pens, animals, etc. clean while on duty.

- Safety – 15%

Beef and Dairy double tied. All equipment stored safely and used in a safe manner. Animals should be handled or worked around in a safe manner. Exhibitors are expected to provide a safe environment for the animals and the public.

- TOTAL – 100%

New for 2019: For those 4-H members wanting their record book to go to community fairs that will be available to pick up from Extension office beginning July 8th to take to the respective community fair. It will be the responsibility of the 4-H member/parent/leader to get their record books for the community fair. Then for the Cowlitz County Fair—the record books will need to be returned by Sunday, July 21st from 2 pm to 5:30 pm in the 4-H Building. If the record book does not come back to the Cowlitz County Fair at that time—the 4-H member will not receive a ribbon or premium for the Cowlitz County Fair.

General Rules—Record Books or a County Demonstration Are Required for Participation at the Cowlitz County Fair

1. Please put record book either in a flat binder or a 1" notebook. Do not put them in a folder nor a notebook larger than 1".
2. Please bring in record books by club and in a box for easy transport by the record book superintendent and record book judges
3. By this entry time....all 4H members should have been working on their record books as part of their club program.
4. Record books must be reflective of your own project work for the 4H year. Those record books that have been done by adults or another 4H member may be disqualified or receive a ribbon placing lower than the original score.
5. **Record books of poor quality (less than 50% score) may be returned to the 4H member to have a chance to improve or may be disqualified**
6. Exhibit tags not required- however be sure that the front cover of the record book is completed- all except address which can be left blank for safety reasons.
7. Please enter via "Fair Entry" for Record Books.
8. Record books are not required for 4-H Cloverbud members. However if interested, Division O Clover Buds Class 10.
9. Record books are **not sent to the 4-H state fair**.

Animal Educational Exhibits/ Posters are due Monday, July 1 from 4:30 to – 6:30 pm in the Floral Building at the Cowlitz County Expo Center.

General rules for both Animal Educational Exhibits and Still Life Educational Exhibits. Please Read!

1. Educational exhibits may show any topic of an educational nature as part of a 4-H project. In order to be judged, it cannot be a collection or display.
2. It must teach something to the public and be readable from 10 feet.
3. The display may include sound, motion, etc.
4. No copyrighted illustration or cartoons may be used in educational displays or posters.
5. **NO GLITTER!!!**
6. Any educational exhibit that is not a current year exhibit will be disqualified at the discretion of the superintendent and/or judge.
7. Educational Exhibits/ Posters entered on “still life entry day” will remain in the 4-H Building and cannot be removed to the barns.
8. For very large displays, contact the Educational Exhibits Superintendent.
9. **ONE BLUE RIBBON EDUCATIONAL EXHIBIT per exhibitor may be entered for the 4-H State Fair.**

ANIMAL EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS RULES AND ENTRIES

1. Animal educational exhibits/posters can be displayed in the respective barns and are due Monday, July 1st in the Floral Building from 4:30 to 6:30 PM, for Judging.
2. Animal educational posters not turned in by the above timeframe may be turned in at the 4-H Building on Sunday July 21st from 2:00 PM to 5:30 PM. However, they will be displayed in the 4-H Still Life Building during fair and not in the barns.

Entry Instructions- Please Read. Failure to follow instructions will disqualify exhibit/ posters.

1. PUT NAME, CLUB NAME, COUNTY NAME AND DATE INCLUDING YEAR IN PERMANENT INK ON BACK OF POSTER.
2. ALSO PUT DIVISION, CLASS AND SUB CLASS ON BACK OF POSTER OR ATTACH TO 3X5 CARD IF AN MOBILE OR DISPLAY.

3. EXHIBITS/ POSTER WILL BE JUDGED WHEN TURNED IN AND WILL BE AVAILABLE TO PICK UP IN THE FLORAL BUILDING, DATE AND TIME TO BE DETERMINED AT ENTRY TIME.
4. NO EXHIBIT TAGS REQUIRED

BEEF INFORMATION

1. Wash racks must be kept clean. All items left on the wash rack will be picked up and kept by the superintendents until asked for. Wash rack, clipping and exercise times will be posted in the 4-H Beef Barn.
2. Calves must be at least three months of age at time of showing in order to be shown in a lot by themselves.
3. No beef animals will be permitted outside of their assigned stall areas unless during respective exercise and/or show times or by permission of the 4-H beef superintendent.
4. Method of watering beef animals will be determined by the 4-H beef superintendent to maintain a safe environment for the public during the time that the fair is open.

5. All stalled animals must be double tied. Animals will be led with a control halter or show halter while on the fairgrounds.
6. Stall assignments are final. Any 4H or FFA member, parent, or leader moving or changing stalls without the permission of the 4H beef superintendent or the respective FFA advisor, may be forfeit their opportunity to exhibit
7. Any 4H member or parent not following the directions of the 4H beef superintendent may forfeit ribbons, premiums, state fair qualifications, and/or be asked to leave the Cowlitz County Fair. This will be done in consultation with the County 4H educator and the Fair Manager.

1. Due to space limitations, exhibitors may only enter one cat. Specific Cat exhibitor information will be sent out after July 1st.
2. A health inspection will take place when animals arrive at the fair. Each cat must show proof of current vaccination against rabies, feline panleukopenia, and chlamydia. **This is required—no exceptions.** An inoculation certificate must be completed at the administering veterinarian's office.
3. No pregnant or nursing cats may be shown. Kittens must be at least 12 weeks of age and completely vaccinated.
4. The 4-H member is responsible for the care and training of the project animal 60 days prior to the fair, and **must care for the cat while on display at the fair.** The 4-H members are responsible for handling the cat, including Cloverbuds—not other adults.
5. Food and water and litter box are the owner's responsibility.
6. Cat cages and decorations and posters are to be set up the day prior to the start of fair before 8 pm and will remain in place until either Saturday night through Fair closing or can be taken down on Sunday morning the day after fair, between 11 am- 2 pm. Cat cages, cage decorations, and posters must remain on display until that time, or the 4-H member may forfeit all awards and premiums.
7. Cats will be displayed and shown in the 4H Building, located in the Expo Center at the west end of the building.
8. ***All cats must be ready for display by 10:00 am on Wednesday of Fair, which is also the cat show day of Fair and will be released up by fair closing time on the on that same show day.*** The cat show will begin approximately at 1 pm on Wednesday of the Fair.
9. **Cats must be kept in their show cages, except when being shown. All cats must be in harness at all times. Cats must remain in the exhibit area and may not be out on the fairgrounds.**
10. Exhibitors must enter fitting and showing, Herdsmanship, cage decoration, and one type class. Costume class is optional. Cat bowl and cat judging are only available if a 4-H leader or 4-H parent organizes it.
11. Cages can be provided for exhibitors. **If you need a cage provided, contact the 4-H cat superintendent prior to July 10th.** Cages are approximately 30.5 inches long X 19.5 inches wide X 21.25 inches in height. All sides of the cage and top may be decorated but cats must remain in full view. If the 4H member has their own cage with similar dimensions, they may use that cage.
12. Each cage must have a small poster (8 1/2 "x 11") introducing the exhibitor and their cat, with a short statement and photo as part of the cage decoration.

13. Cloverbud members, who exhibit in the Cat Division will do so on a non-competitive basis only and be awarded rainbow colored ribbons and 12 premium points per Class and/ or Sub- Class. See Animal Cloverbud *Division O for Classes to enter*.

14. Cloverbud members should demonstrate competence in exhibiting and caring for animal projects prior to exhibiting at fairs, shows, or similar events

1. Health requirements set by Washington State 4-H Dog Program and Cowlitz County 4-H Dog Program will be enforced and followed as directed by the 4-H County Educator and 4-H Dog Superintendent.
2. Dogs must be clean and fully groomed.
3. All dogs must have proof of current vaccinations: **Rabies, distemper combination (including parovirus and parainfluenza), and bordetella**. Proof of a current rabies vaccination by a **licensed veterinarian** will be required for the health vet check.
4. All dogs will be given a health check by an animal health professional prior to the opening of Fair for disease and parasites. Those dogs with disease and/or parasites will be barred from showing. ***The time and day of the health check will be communicated after July 1st by the dog superintendent.***
5. Members must be enrolled in the Dog Project and provide care and management by April 1. **Due to space limitations, open to Cowlitz County 4-H Dog members only**
6. 4-H exhibitors will be entered in classes for which they and their dog are most qualified. (See Washington 4-H Dog Program Guidelines for clarification.)
7. Only one entry permitted in each Sub- Class. 4-H members may share a dog as outlined by Washington State 4-H Dog Program Guidelines and with prior approval of the 4-H Dog Superintendent.
8. If 4-H County Dog Rules are in conflict with State rules (State Fair and Washington State 4-H Dog Program Guidelines) State rules will prevail with the county 4-H educator having final authority.
9. Herdsmanship is required. Failure to do so may result in loss of premium points. The purpose of Herdsmanship is to teach exhibitors how to care for their dogs and equipment to the best of their ability at a show or fair. It is also an excellent opportunity for 4-H members to educate the public on dog care and training.

10. Herdsmanship, grooming, handling, and exercise of the dog must be performed by the 4-H exhibitors. Violations of this rule create loss of learning experience to the exhibitor and unfair competition to other members, particularly in the Fitting and Showing Contest. Pride in your pet and yourself will be reflected in a well maintained exhibit and healthy, safe care of your animals.

11. Those not complying with 4-H dog rules and 4-H Code of Conduct may forfeit all premiums, awards, State Fair qualifications, and may be excused from the fair, with the 4-H county educator having the final authority.

Intermediate and Senior members can bring up to 3 horses to fair but they must be in three different riding disciplines (*Performance; Western Games and/or Harness Driving*). This is dependent upon a space available basis and seniority in the 4-H Horse Project.

Rules for classes can be found on the WSU 4-H Cowlitz County Horse Section website located at <https://extension.wsu.edu/cowlitz/4h/horse-division/> This will include the PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide; Disciplined Rail and the Cowlitz County 4-H Horse policy guide. The 2019 Barn Rules and Western Dressage information will be sent to 4-H horse leaders after July 1st.

All 4-H horse leaders are responsible for communicating the entry information; class rules; and Barn rules to their 4-H members and parents. Each main club leader is responsible for having the correct 4-H Horse entry forms and instructions received at the May mandatory horse project committee meeting. Follow specific project instructions from your main horse club leader.

Vet Check: Vet check takes place 3:00-7:00 pm on the day prior to the Fair. 4-H Horse Exhibitors will enter on 3rd Avenue only and follow signs to vet check area.

Orientation: Required orientation for all 4-H members, leaders, and parents will be at 7:30 pm on the day prior to the Fair. Refer to signs in the 4-H Horse Barn for location of this required orientation.

1. All exhibitors must enter Fitting and Showing and at least one riding class.
2. Premiums will be paid on only one Fitting and Showing class and ON THE HIGHEST CLASS per horse in **Performance** or **Western Games**. When entering more than one horse, exhibitor will be paid on only one fitting and showing for one of their horses and the highest riding class on each horse in their respective disciplines.
3. Exhibitors must choose on their 4-H horse entry form whether they want to receive premiums in either **Performance** or **Western Games**. Performance includes the additional disciplines of Harness Driving, Dressage (English and/or Western), and/or Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences.

2. All Rabbit entries must be permanently tattooed in left ear. Contact 4-H rabbit superintendent for information or details.
3. The Fair Entry must be Complete with correct age, sex, breed and variety of rabbit, if purebred. Be sure exhibits are entered in correct Class and Sub- Class. Animals entered improperly may receive white awards only.

10. Awards will be placed on breeds recognized by the Standards of Perfection of the ARBA and with the exception of cross breeds and meat classes which will be judged on meat quality only.

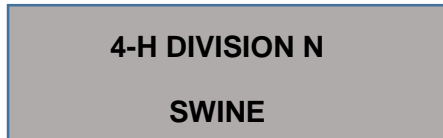

1. This division is for 4-H members completing Kindergarten, first and second grades, ages 5-7 years old as of October 1, 2018. The focus of this age group is not competition. It is an opportunity to experience the process of doing a project or activity. The purpose is not to be judged against a standard. This division must be focused on the developmental stages of k-2nd grade.
2. Cloverbud members should demonstrate competence in exhibiting and caring for animal projects prior to exhibiting at fairs, shows, or similar events.
3. Cloverbud members will receive a Rainbow colored ribbon rather than a blue, red or white ribbon.
4. No large animals (beef, sheep, swine, dairy goat, dairy cow or horse) are allowed as a project for Cloverbud 4-H members.
5. **Must enter via “Fair Entry” by July 1st. This date is for animals only.**
6. Cloverbud members are eligible to exhibit small animals- cats, cavy, dog, pocket pets, poultry, pygmy goat or rabbits. If they do so, the animal project will be housed in the respective barn and will follow the exhibit and Herdsmanship requirements of that exhibit area.
7. Cloverbud members who choose to exhibit their animals in the barns will do so on a non- competitive basis. They will receive a rainbow colored ribbon per Class and/ or Sub- Class and receive 12 premium points. They will not receive the standard Danish System of judging of a blue, red or white.
8. They can also choose to have an “interview” with the designated “Cloverbud Judge” with or without their animals. **THIS MUST BE SCHEDULED WITH THE CLOVERBUD SUPERINTENDENT, NOT THE RESPECTIVE ANIMAL SUPERINTENDENT.**
9. “Interviews” are to be scheduled with the Cloverbud Superintendent on Sunday, July 21nd at 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm in the 4-H Building at the Cowlitz County Fairgrounds. They will receive a rainbow colored ribbon and 20 premium points.
10. For questions about the Cloverbud requirements, contact the Cloverbud Superintendent.
11. For questions about the barn exhibit requirements, show schedule, Herdsmanship, etc. contact the respective animal superintendent.
